## FROM PASTOR YEISER'S DESK:

---

We are now in the season of Lent. This liturgical season began on Ash Wednesday and lasts forty days (excluding Sundays which are always feast days celebrating the resurrection.) The word Lent originally meant "spring" and is to be understood as a time to reflect on baptism and its basis in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Lent is a time of rebirth and renewal in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection. The liturgical color for Lent is purple, which suggests somberness and solemnity. During Lent special emphasis is placed on spiritual cleansing, penitence, humility, self-examination, meditation on the wonder and mystery of God's amazing love, and a deepening of the devotional life of the mind and heart.

The word "spirituality" is oftentimes uttered during this liturgical season. This term's modern technical use includes piety, the devout life, and an interior life of prayer; and yet it means even more than all of this. As the twentieth century Roman Catholic theologian Hans Urs von Balthasar put it; "it means the way a person understands his/her own ethically and religiously committed existence, and the way he/she acts and reacts habitually to this understanding." During Lent, then, there is a stress on examining the spiritual life, getting in better touch with ones' spirituality through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, and living the life our

Lord calls Christians to live.

Praying, fasting, and charitable giving, the disciplines of Lent, are stressed and practiced by many during the forty days. Other practices include meditating, and reading and studying the scriptures. In regard to the latter, I refer you to the Book of Psalms.

The psalms are hymns quite rich in meditative value. They are a natural fit with the themes of the season of Lent. There are 150 of them divided into five books that represent a variety of literary forms. There are hymns of praise, songs of thanksgiving, laments (the most common psalm), royal psalms, enthronement psalms, psalms of blessing and cursing, and psalms of wisdom or instruction. In the Torah (Law) and prophetic books of the Hebrew Bible or Old Testament, God speaks to people through Moses or the prophets. In the Book of Psalms, people speak to God. Thus they are great worship and devotional tools.

Make no mistake about it, the psalmists get right down in the trenches of life and express common yearnings, questions, and responses of humanity. As we read them we can easily find ourselves identifying with the psalmists emotionally and spiritually. Psalms, in a sense, are laughs and cries to God. Recall Jesus quoting Psalm 22:1 from the cross.

Meanwhile, we are looking at a backlog of approximately 80 books to go through to ascertain whether they are already on the shelves or possibly not Lutheran oriented.

We have just placed a complete set of Guideposts hardback books authored by Janette Oke that are called her "Keepsake Series." There are sixteen book titles that have been placed into eight volumes and they have been given in loving memory of Mrs. Esther Markle by Mrs. Betty L. Witmer.

**OUR SUNDAY SCHOOL'S LENTEN PROJECT FOR HEIFER PROJECT INTERNATIONAL** is underway. We "chicked off" the annual special offering for Heifer Project International on February 10 and will conclude on Easter Sunday. At one dollar per chick (a buck a cluck!) we look forward to sending flocks of chickens to people in need. We distributed plastic eggs in Sunday School to our 2 year olds through 6<sup>th</sup> graders which may be filled with coins and cash for HPI chicks. Older youth or adults are also welcome to pick up an egg at the Hospitality Desk or the church office to fill for HPI. (Offerings in envelopes are fine, too!) We'll collect them on Easter Sunday to see how many chickens we "hatched." (One idea



for filling your egg: for each egg you eat in any way during the day, put in an amount of change or even a dollar bill for those who are watching their cholesterol!!)

**FIRST COMMUNION CLASS** for our 5<sup>th</sup> graders or older youth not yet instructed will be held on Saturday, March 15, 9:30 to noon, in Fellowship Hall. An informational letter will be sent out soon with details about the day. Parents are to attend with their youth and move through our learning stations together. There will also be time for questions and answers with one



of the pastors while the children have discussion with Miss Jan. Those completing the class may celebrate their First Communion on Palm Sunday, March 16, during the 10:30 a.m. service.



**THE KITE RUNNER** is our Book Discussion Group's next "great read!" 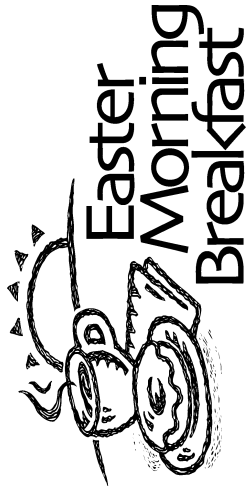
