From the Desk of Pastor Kathy Vitalis Hoffman:

Dear Friends in Christ,

The current mission for our congregation has this tag line: *Celebrating God's Love, Serving in Jesus' Name*. As I am growing in my understanding of St. Matthew, I believe it is a good description. We do celebrate God's love as we gather to worship, grow in our understanding of God's Word and share the message of Christ's love for all people. We also serve in Jesus' name in the many outreach ministries we support and the activities of service that we do.

It is one thing to know our mission; it's a bigger challenge for us to live into the mission as we set priorities for our congregation. How do we, as St. Matthew Lutheran Church, live into the mission we share in our particular location, at this particular time? This question is especially important for us as we continue to adapt, adjust, pivot and rethink our activities in light of the coronavirus. How do we remain faithful to the mission of Jesus Christ facing the current realities of our community, nation and world?

These are the questions that are asked all through the scriptures. The Bible is a book of books that relate to specific places and times in history. For example, in the book of Romans, Paul is writing this letter (which is long enough to be called a book!) to a specific church, at a specific time. He describes for this congregation how they actively live the faith. Martin Luther has helped the church understand that in the Bible, we discover a living Word that not only guides us but also changes us to be renewed in Christ. (Romans 12:1-2.)

A couple of years ago, I read the book called, *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory*. The author, Tod Bolsinger, describes the present challenges of the church to be like the challenges Lewis and Clark faced when they discovered that there was no water route that would connect to the Pacific Ocean. They found themselves in uncharted territory that forced them to ditch the canoes in order to navigate the mountains. I find this comparison to be helpful as I think about the ways the churches need to navigate differently in the uncharted territory of our present realities. What worked before in our congregations is not working in the same ways.

I believe that we are at an exciting time in the life of our congregation as we intentionally listen to God through the scriptures, one another and our neighbors to whom we are called to love and serve. Please note the Listening Sessions scheduled this month. I am excited to put down my oars and get my hiking boots on. We have a great adventure ahead. *For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord.....to give you a future with hope.* From Jeremiah 29:11.

Results of AUGUST 24 Blood Drive

The Red Cross drive was a great success! 41 people presented, 38 successfully donated. 32 of those were whole blood and 6 were Power Reds (power reds count as two units). So we collected a total of 44 units impacting up to 136 lives! Thank you to everyone who signed up.

Guidelines for Returning to Indoor Worship

Masks will be required. Temperatures will be taken upon entering. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will be asked to return home.

We ask that everyone practice social distancing (at least 6 feet, excluding households) when in the church building.

For those who are feeling ill, have compromised immune systems, or are at high risk, please continue to utilize our drive-in worship or on-line worship opportunities for your safety and the safety of others.

All hymnals, papers, etc. have been removed from the pew racks, and the cushions have been removed from the pews we are using.

Everyone will enter through the elevator lobby doors and porte-co-chere doors. No one should park in the porte-co-chere. The area needs to be accessible for emergency vehicles to enter and exit.

Bulletins, communion cups and Ziploc baggies (for empty communion cups) will be handed out as people enter.

Seating will be as directed by the Ushers with social distancing being practiced (one household unit per pew or 2 individuals.) Pews will be marked for seating, with two empty pews between the seated rows. Please be considerate of the ushers as you are seated. We can only be indoors if everyone abides by the guidelines.

Communion will be with the wafer and disposable communion cups in the pew. A Ziploc baggie will be supplied for disposal of the empty cups. A waste basket for the communion cup baggies will be placed at the exits.

There will be a basket at each entrance and exit for the offering.

The men's and women's bathrooms outside of Fellowship Hall will be available for use. Linda will be available to clean between uses.

Everyone will exit through the door they entered and as directed by the ushers. **The ushers will release everyone a row at a time.**

There will be no nursery care available.

CARING CUPBOARD!

Social Ministry Committee is creating a Caring Cupboard in conjunction with the annual ELCA "God's Work, Our Hands Day" on September 13, 2020. A Caring Cupboard is a small cabinet which will be placed somewhere on the St. Matthew grounds. It is basically a take one or leave one arrangement. If you want to donate food and/or paper goods to it, you may put it in the cupboard! If someone in the community (or in the church) needs some food and/or paper goods, they may take some from the cupboard! We are wondering if anyone has a cupboard they would be willing to donate - or if someone would be willing to build one (funded by Social Ministry Committee.) It would have to be sturdy, weatherproof and should have a clear window in the front.
