


FROM CONGREGATION COUNCIL - NEW GUIDELINES FOR WORSHIP

Due to the highly contagious nature of the Delta variant of Covid and our desire to be welcoming to children under 12, Council agreed on the following decisions:

- To **keep masks optional** for vaccinated people at our Saturday, 5:00 service. Those who are unvaccinated, please continue to wear a mask.
- To extend our 8:30 Drive-In/Outdoor worship **through November 21**.
- To **require masks** at our 10:30 indoor worship regardless of vaccination status.
- To remain committed to **offering online worship** through live-streaming.

The Council hopes that this variety of worship offerings will provide you with options that fit a diversity of comfort levels and health needs.

1. We continue to distance people by separating chairs and marking pews to be used.
2. We continue the current procedures for communion and offerings through the fall. A waste basket for the communion cups and napkins is placed at the exits.
3. Offering plates will not be passed. There is a basket at the door.

We hope you find this worship service meaningful. If you have concerns about your car battery, we have people on the premises with battery cables should the need arise.



Elementary Connections

Kids can expect to build relationships with their peers and leaders and explore what it means to be Lutheran and Christian.



High School Connections

For our siblings in Christ who are in 9th-12th grades, we will gather together in the Fellowship Hall and then travel with leaders upstairs to the Youth Suite to spend time together. We will engage in discussions connecting world events with the Bible, faith and everyday life.

Parent Connections

For our siblings in Christ who are parenting children of all ages, you are invited to join a Parenting Cohort in the foyer outside the sanctuary after Opening in the Fellowship Hall. Parents (and parent figures) can expect to share joys and challenges with one another and hold caring conversations about faith practices for personal life, family life, and child development.




New Member Class

A native of Germany, Felix Hell is one of the most sought after concert organists in the world. He has been featured as a recitalist and concerto soloist in more than 1000 concerts throughout North America, Europe, Asia and Australia. Felix Hell's discography includes 12 CDs. His recordings are frequently broadcast throughout the United States and across the world; he has appeared on television globally.



His project "Music Across America" allows him to travel with his own Touring Organ, performing organ concertos and recitals in spaces that do not house pipe organs, liberating the instrument from its historic confines.

Felix Hell is known for his diverse and innovative programming, drawing upon a repertoire encompassing five centuries. Furthermore, he has received global recognition for his marathon performances of the entire organ works of J.S. Bach, which encompass about 250 compositions and close to 20 hours of performance time. He has since performed the complete Bach cycle four times, most recently in 2013 in Seoul, Korea.

Felix Hell studied at the Juilliard School in New York, the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia (BM), the Peabody Institute in Baltimore (AD, MM, DMA). In 2007, he received Johns Hopkins University's prestigious Outstanding Graduate Award.

Mr. Hell holds positions of Organ Artist Associate at Saint Peter's Lutheran Church in Manhattan, Distinguished Artist in Residence at the United Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg, and Adjunct Professor of Organ at the Sunderman Conservatory in Gettysburg, PA. In 2011, Felix Hell was appointed Distinguished Visiting Artist at Kosin University in Busan, South Korea.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 53:4-12

Surely he has borne our infirmities
and carried our diseases;
yet we accounted him stricken,
struck down by God, and afflicted.
⁵But he was wounded for our transgressions,

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to

offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ²He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; ³and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. ⁴And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

⁵So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

"You are my Son,
today I have begotten you";
⁶as he says also in another place,
"You are a priest forever,
according to the order of Melchizedek."

⁷In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; ⁹and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

GOSPEL: Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." ³⁶And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" ³⁷And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." ³⁸But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" ³⁹They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; ⁴⁰but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

⁴¹When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. ⁴²So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. ⁴³But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."
